

Wednesdays, October 27, November 3, 10, 17, (no 11/24) December 1 & 8, 2021

Please do **not** sweep leaves into the street or road. Leaves accumulate into catch basins and clog them creating drainage problems.

Final Leaf Collection date is December 4, 2019!



**NOTE**: If you have leaves that need to be picked up after the official Leaf Collection is over, please call the Highway Office at 860-446-4127 and leave your name, address, phone number and about how many bags of leaves you have and we will pick them up on a Wednesday. One week notice is required.

Please do **not** sweep your leaves into the street or road. Leaves accumulate into the catch basins and clog them up creating drainage problems.

#### Trash & Recycling Pickup Schedules for Holidays:

- → If a holiday falls on a Tuesday, and this is your pickup day, it will be picked up on Wednesday morning
- → If a holiday falls on a Wednesday, and this is your pickup day, it will be picked up Thursday morning
- ★ If a holiday falls on a Thursday, and this is your pickup day, it will be picked up on Friday morning\*
- → If a holiday falls on a Friday, and this is your pickup day, it will be picked up on Thursday morning\*

\*For Thanksgiving Day and the Day after Thanksgiving, if these are your pickup days, Thursday Thanksgiving Day will be picked up on Wednesday morning and Friday the Day-After Thanksgiving Day will be picked up on the following Monday morning.


